# Purpose of the Visit

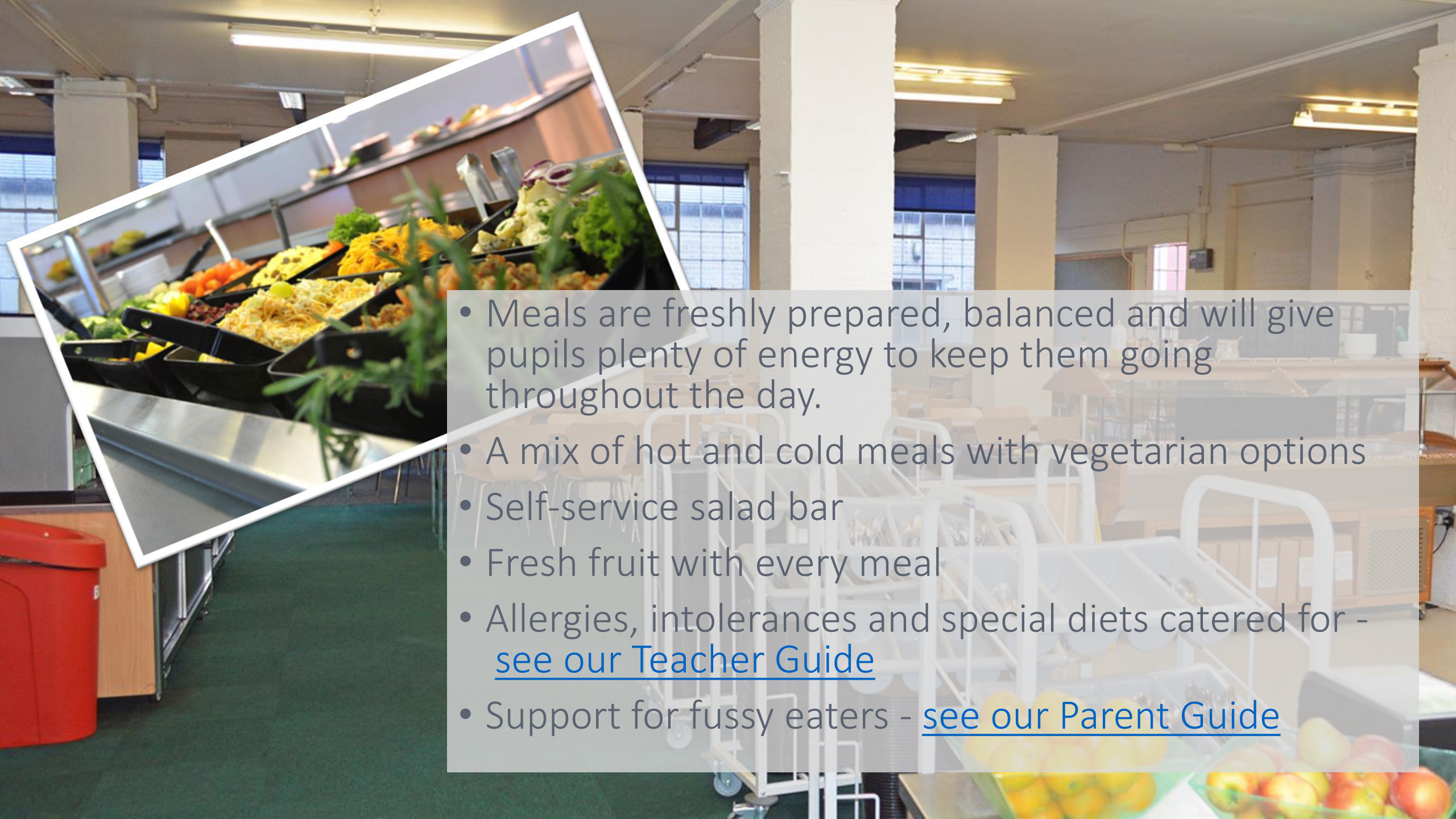
- The children will be given the opportunity to experience activities they might not otherwise try and to visit different places in safe surroundings.
- They learn to cooperate with each other and often develop new, supportive friendships.
- For many children it is the first time away from their families; this develops their self-confidence and independence.
- Children are taken away from their electronic and communication devices for a few days.
- They learn good social skills in relating to the instructors and staff on-site.
- The children will have a great time!



# Accommodation

- Children will stay in blocks of chalets or indoor rooms, with up to 4 - 9 children in each chalet or room.
- Teachers will stay in attached chalets or rooms.
- On-site security is in place for 24 hours. The site is enclosed
- The children are provided with three substantial cooked meals a day
- There are large halls for evening activities





- Meals are freshly prepared, balanced and will give pupils plenty of energy to keep them going throughout the day.
- A mix of hot and cold meals with vegetarian options
- Self-service salad bar
- Fresh fruit with every meal

Each day there will be activities. The instructors on site are fully qualified. Each group will have a Firs Farm adult in attendance.

# A typical Day

07.00 - 08.50	Get up, get ready and fuel up for the day ahead with a hearty breakfast.
08.50 - 12.00	Morning activities - 2 sessions with a 10 minute break in-between.
12.00 - 13.50	Enjoy a fresh and tasty two-course hot lunch and some free time.
13.50 - 17.00	Afternoon activities - 2 sessions with a 10 minute break in-between.
17.00 - 19.00	Time to eat again - a different dinner menu each day.
19.00 - 21.00	Discos, campfires, quizzes and more - our evening entertainment programme keeps everyone engaged until bedtime.
21.00 / 21.30	Bedtime. Catch up on some zzz's ready to do it all again tomorrow!



# Health and Safety

- In school there will be a structured behaviour system – children will start on Green and you will be told if they move to Amber or Red. Once on Red, if behaviour does not improve, your child will not be permitted to come on the trip. This also applies if your child were to have a fixed term exclusion.
- Safety is of paramount importance. We cannot allow anyone's safety to be compromised by inappropriate and dangerous behaviours.
- If a child's behaviour is unacceptable, you will be asked to collect your child within 12 hours.



## Cost

- The full cost will be approximately £291. Once all the deposits are confirmed we will inform you of the final cost.
- The price includes – accommodation, 3 meals a day, trained staff on site, transport and insurance.
- Children also have the opportunity to bring a small amount of pocket money with them.

## How to Pay

- Please log on to Arbor and pay a deposit of £50 to secure your child's space.
- The online payment will open at 7pm on Friday 4<sup>th</sup> October and close at 9 am on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> October.
- If you have any difficulty making your payment using Arbor, then please speak to Mrs Antoniou in the school office.
- The number of places is not limited.
- We will hold a waiting list for anyone who wants a place after the deposit deadline.
- Payments are non-refundable unless another child takes your child's place.
