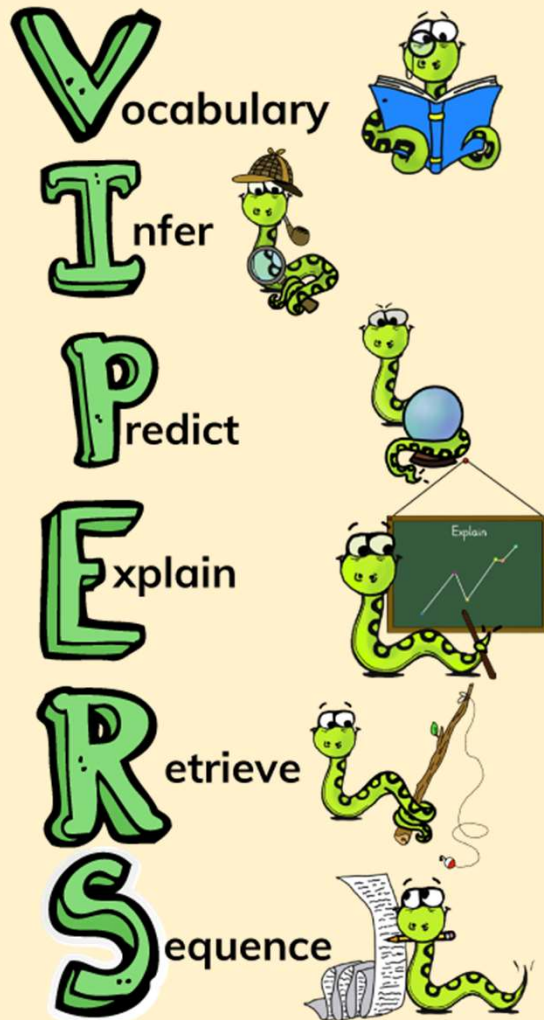
READING FOR

When children have a home library, as little as **20 books** of their own, they achieve **3 more years** of schooling than children who don't have any books at home.

1,800,000 words

Vocabulary Check

Vocabulary: Using a dictionary, if needed, to check the meaning of words.

- in a little cottage
- enchanted wood
- Saucepan Man

Cottage: a small house, typically one in the country

Enchanted: a magical place, under a spell

Saucepan: a deep cooking pan, typically round, made of metal, and with one long handle



*Retrieval: Finding the answers
directly inside the text.*

- **Who** were the main three children?
(R)
- **Who** was coming to stay with the
children? (R)
- **Why** is he coming to stay? (R)

Infer: Thinking about what the text is telling us.

Explain: Using our ideas and own experiences to justify our answer.



Individual Thinking

'He was a happy boy, rather naughty, and it would be such fun to have him.'

Why do you think they thought it would be fun for Rick to stay with them? (I, E)

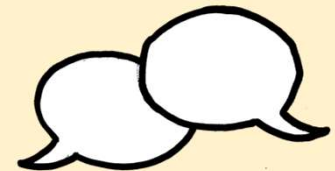


The three children flew upstairs

going on?*

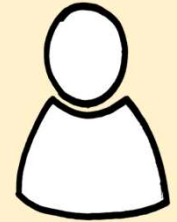
Partnered Talk
