Maths Curriculum

This term we will be focusing on:

- Number and Place Value
- Addition and Subtraction
- Multiplication and Division

We will be focusing on fluency, reasoning and problem solving.

Ways you can help your child with their maths: Make sure that your child knows their times tables. They should know their 2s, 5s, and 10s and now focusing on their 3s, 4s and 8s.

English Curriculum

- Grammar: Nouns, adjectives, verbs and tenses
- Spellings: Year 3 statutory spelling list
- Reading list: Who killed Tutankhamun, Storm, Forgotten fairy tales of brave and brilliant girls.

Reading

Children who are on the Oxford Reading Tree levels will be read with every week by Mrs Sancar.

Free Readers can choose a book from home or from the book corner to read. We recommend that all children join their local library. We suggest that you read at least one non fiction book a month. Free readers to complete a book review.

Ways you can help your child with their reading:

Ensure they are reading 20 minutes, daily.

PE Days

- 3C PE days are: **Monday and Thursday**
- Please ensure your child wears their full PE uniform. This should include:
 - Black shorts or Jogging bottoms for colder weather
 - House T-Shirt
 - Plain black trainers (limited branding & colours)
 - Please note that for girls, leggings and cycling shorts are not acceptable.
 - For safety reasons, children should have long hair tied back and no jewellery during these lessons

Children should come into school wearing their PE uniform on these days.

School Uniform

Please remember that our school uniform is:

Maroon sweatshirt Maroon fleece (for outdoor wear only) Grey skirt or pinafore Grey or black trousers Black leggings are allowed underneath skirts/pinafores Plain white, black or grey socks or tights Trainers and boots are not allowed indoors. Shoes should be black and appropriate for school.

Children should not wear jewellery except for watches (not smart watches) and small studs in pierced ears.



Homework



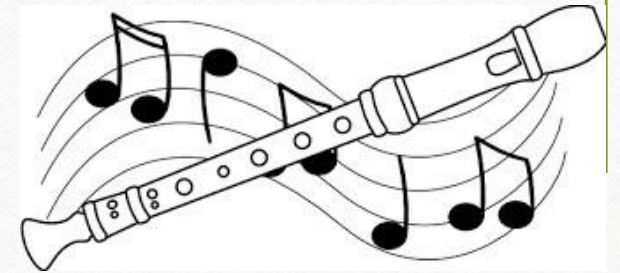
Weekly homework is:

The usual plan is to: drop off the children to school on Friday evening and collect Saturday morning.

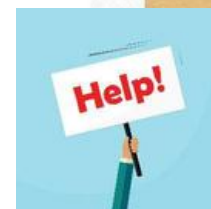
This usually costs between £7-10
